ORDINANCE NO. 2000-2**

**AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE REFERRING A MILL LEVY AND DEBT
AUTHORIZATION BALLOT QUESTION FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSTRUCTING
A SEWER SYSTEM FOR THE MAIN STREET AREA TO THE NOVEMBER 7TH, 2000
ELECTION**

WHEREAS the Town Board has received a Federal 201 Wastewater Facilities Plan prepared by Rothberg, Tamburini and Winsor which states the current need for wastewater treatment; and,
WHEREAS the Town of Rico Home Rule ARTICLE VIII authorizes the Town to refer property tax mill levy questions to the voters in Rico;

**NOW THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF RICO
ORDAINS:**

Section 1. Referral of Ballot Question. The following ballot question is hereby referred to the November 7th, 2000, general election:

“SHALL THE TOWN OF RICO’S DEBT, OR RICO WATER AND/OR SANITATION DISTRICT IF FORMED, DEBT BE INCREASED \$275,000.00 WITH A MAXIMUM REPAYMENT COST OF UP TO \$441,335.00; AND SHALL THE TOWN OF RICO’S TAXES BE INCREASED \$22,500.00 ANNUALLY by the imposition of an additional mill levy not to exceed 3.939 mills, effective January 1, 2001, and shall the Town or District be permitted to collect, retain and expend the full proceeds of such tax revenue generated from 3.939 mills and shall the Town or District be permitted to receive, retain and expend any state or federal grant proceeds for the purpose of constructing and operating a waste water treatment system and repaying debt incurred for the construction of such waste water treatment system, not notwithstanding any state restrictions on fiscal year spending, including without limitation Article X, Section 20 of the Colorado Constitution?”

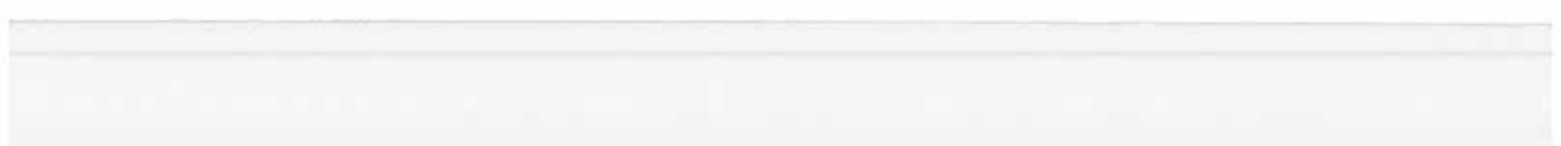

**ESTABLISHING THE RICO SUN-TIMES AS THE OFFICIAL PAPER OF RECORD
FOR PUBLICATION OF NOTICES AND REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 323**

WHEREAS the Rico Home Rule Charter §14.11 allows the Town to determine the publishing of notices and designate a newspaper for such publishing; and,

WHEREAS Ordinance No. 323 was adopted by the Town and designates the Dolores Star as the official paper of record for the Town of Rico Home; and,

WHEREAS the Rico Town Board finds that the Rico Sun Times is a locally based paper with general circulation in the Town of Rico, which started after designating the Dolores Star as the official paper of record, and the Town Board further finds that the Rico community will be better served with less cost by using on the Rico Sun Times as the official paper of record for publication of notices.

NOW THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF RICO ORDAINS that the Rico Sun-Times is hereby designated as the official paper of record for publication of notices and Ordinance No. 2000-3 is hereby repealed.

1. The following reaction scheme shows the synthesis of a complex organic molecule. The starting material is a substituted benzene ring with a methyl group and a hydroxyl group. The reaction proceeds through several steps involving reagents such as H_2SO_4 , HNO_3 , and H_2 . The final product is a highly substituted benzene ring with multiple functional groups.

2. The reaction of a substituted benzene ring with H_2SO_4 and HNO_3 yields a mixture of products. The major product is a nitro-substituted benzene ring, while the minor product is a sulfonated benzene ring. The reaction conditions and the nature of the substituents on the benzene ring influence the distribution of products.

3. The reaction of a substituted benzene ring with H_2 and a catalyst yields a saturated ring system. The reaction is exothermic and proceeds rapidly at room temperature. The product is a substituted cyclohexane ring with the same substituents as the starting material.

4. The reaction of a substituted benzene ring with H_2SO_4 and HNO_3 yields a mixture of products. The major product is a nitro-substituted benzene ring, while the minor product is a sulfonated benzene ring.

**AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE YEAR 2001 TOWN BUDGET;
APPROPRIATING SUMS OF MONEY; AND, SETTING AND CERTIFYING TOWN
MILL LEVIES**

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees designated Eric Heil, as Town Manager, to prepare and submit a proposed budget to the Governing Body; and,

WHEREAS, a public hearing was noticed and scheduled for the 13th day of December in accordance with the law and no quorum of the Town Board was present, and such public hearing was continued until the 14th day of December and no quorum of the Town Board was present, and an emergency meeting was scheduled for the 15th day of December, 2000;

WHEREAS, the Rico Town Board finds that the adoption of the budget is essential to the provision of basic and necessary services and finds that this emergency ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the health, safety, and general welfare of the Rico community; and,

WHEREAS, the Town of Rico has adopted the budget in accordance with the Local Government Budget Law on 15th day of December, 2000; and,

WHEREAS, the Town of Rico has made provisions therein for revenues in an amount equal to or greater than the total proposed described below; and,

WHEREAS, the 2001 valuation for the Town of Rico as certified by the County Assessor is \$5,658,608.00; and,

NOW, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the Board of Trustees, the following:

SECTION 1. BUDGETED REVENUES AND EXPENDITURES

That for the purpose of meeting all street fund expenses of the Town of Rico during the 2001 budget year there is hereby levied a tax of 1.785 mils upon each dollar of the total valuation for assessment of all taxable property within the Town for year 2000.
